## **Sumter 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan: Action Items Report Card**

Year 1: 2024

The SUATS 2050 LRTP represents an important step toward implementing multimodal improvements that affect travel safety, mobility, development patterns, and the aesthetics of the Sumter region. The action items list appropriate steps for local leaders to implement the recommendations of this plan and key agencies that should be involved with the task. While all listed items are not expected to be completed within the 5 year lifecycle of the current LRTP, the process should be initiated. The success of this plan hinges on the City and County continuing to work with and educate local citizens and businesses. This annual report card offers a tool for the members of the Sumter Community to understand status of various actions and advocate for further progress.


## **Highlights**

<u>Penny for Progress Referendum Success</u> - In November 2024, the voters of Sumter County overwhelmingly approved a renewal of the "Penny for Progress" one-cent sales tax for capital projects. Included in the list of approved projects are 10 separate transportation improvement categories, representing 44% of the total initiative's funding. This success will provide resources over the next 8 years to bring to reality projects identified in the Long-Range Transportation Plan.

<u>TAP Grant Awarded for Folsom Park/Uptown Sidewalk Project</u> - In December 2024, the City of Sumter was awarded an \$800,000 Transporattion Alternatives Program (TAP) grant to complete engineering design and initial development work for 3.68 miles of new sidewalk on 6 streets in the Uptown/Folsom Park area of the City. These sidewalks will fill critical gaps along highly traveled streets where there are no pedestrian facilities currently available.

<u>City Street Development Standards Updated</u> - In April 2024, Sumter City Council adopted a comprehensive update to its <u>Zoning</u> & <u>Development Standards Ordinance</u> that updated Article 8.d., which regulates new street development. The improvements made included increasing minimum width of new sidewalks from 4.5 to 5 ft., a policy statement discouraging use of cul-de-sacs in residential devleopment, clarity regarding street dimension standards, and enhanced standards for new street construction.
