Every week in Sumter County,
someone dies or is **seriously injured**
in a crash on our streets.

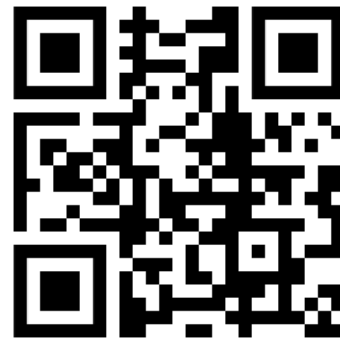

Vision Zero Communities

Hoboken, NJ

What?

Zero traffic related deaths in the past **8** years

How?

- Daylighting
- High visibility crosswalks
- Curb bulb outs

Fremont, CA

What?

Between 2015-2021, Fremont saw a **45% reduction** in major crashes

How?

- Quick build projects
- Streetlights
- Crosswalk upgrades
- Speed limit reduction
- Road diets

Alexandria, VA

What?

Zero traffic related deaths in 2023

How?

- No Turn on Red restrictions
- New sidewalks
- Leading pedestrian intervals
- “Click it or ticket” campaign
