

MOBILE FOOD VENDOR/FOOD TRUCK TEMPORARY USE PERMIT FACT SHEET

Food Trucks, further defined as "Mobile Food Units" in the City of Sumter Zoning and Development Standards Ordinance and in the Sumter County Zoning & Development Standards Ordinance, must obtain Temporary Use Approval for each specific site at which operations will take place, under the following criteria:



LOCATIONS ALLOWED:

- Private or public property located in the General Commercial (GC), Limited Commercial (LC), Light Industrial-Warehouse (LI-W), or Heavy Industrial (HI) zoning districts of the City of Sumter and/or unincorporated Sumter County. (In unincorporated Sumter County, Food Trucks may also operate on Agricultural Conservation (AC) zoned property.)
- Selected property(s) must also have at least 1 active business legally operating from the site.
- Temporary Use Permits are <u>not</u> required for operation at City-sponsored events and City-authorized Farmers Markets. However, approval from the sponsoring entity and a valid City-County business license are required.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR INITIAL BUSINESS LICENSE APPROVAL AND FIRST TEMPORARY USE LOCATION

- 1. Written permission from the property owner or their authorized representative.
- 2. Photos of the food truck/mobile vending unit.
- 3. Copy of SC DHEC food inspection certificate.
- 4. Location of SC DHEC approved commissary for food preparation.
- 5. Copy of completed SLED CATCH background check (https://catch.sled.sc.gov/).

TEMPORARY USE PERMIT FEE AND VALIDITY

- \$30 fee for each Temporary Use Permit location.
- Temporary Use Permits are valid for 365 days from the date of issuance.
